Innovators Expo to feature inventions that changed world

The Innovators Expo will be held from 9:30 to 4 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 22, at the Sugar River Technical Center, 112 South St. in Claremont. The event is free and open to the public.

The expo features all American-made inventions that changed the world including a 3-D steam engine, the 1804 birth of IBM, 1919 and 2012 New Hampshire fire engines, a working grist and saw mill model, a state-of-the-art crane, a plasma torch, a multi-fuel tractor and the world's best lobster trap.

From Fish Oil to Mars Rover, N.E. Tech Prowess on Display

CLAREMONT — In the 1840s, William Nye started a business that produced lubricating oils from fish heads for watches, clocks, and other delicate instruments. Today, that same Massachusetts firm makes synthetic oil that is being used on the recently launched Mars Rover.

Its survival and growth through changing economic times is the byproduct of innovation and engineering, said Gerry DeMuro, of Heritage Mills, a nonprofit dedicated to preserving the history of New England manufacturing.

Both companies will be among several represented at tomorrow's innovation and engineering expo at the Sugar River Tech-
